Water bottle


Appropriate coat (provided all year round)

*Curriculum:

Autumn Term – WW2

We will build on our WW2 learning from Year 5 to explore the impact felt by Britain in World War 2.

Spring Term- Around the World: UK

We will look at the geography of the area around us, understanding key people, places and events that have supported the development of the town. We will also learn about rivers, using the River Orwell to support our field work.

Summer Term- The Ancient Kingdom of Benin

We will develop and apply historical skills, using sources of information, to explore the Ancient Kingdom of Benin. We will think about concepts such as invasion and empire throughout our learning.



SATS (Standardised Assessment Tests):

We endeavour to make the SATs as easy and stress – free as possible. As you can appreciate, most of the year will be driven towards SATs (for Reading, Maths and Grammar). However, this is just a part of Year 6 and the curriculum we have designed also allows children to explore around them and the part they play in the world.

Year Group Expectations:

Homework Expectations

- 5 reads each week, with a short comment written by the child and signed by an adult.
 Reads will be checked every Monday.
 - 1 piece of maths and/or SPaG homework, set on a Friday and <u>due on a Wednesday</u>
- * Regular practise of spellings for a Frieay test.
- Regular practise of times tables

Homework is important to consolidate in-school learning. When homework is not handed in, late or incomplete, consequences may be given.



How You Can Help:

The most important thing you can do at home is to read with your child at home **everyday**. Reading is the key to their success in Primary School.

Knowing times tables is an essential part of mathematics, therefore it is important that you also practise times tables, particularly 7s, 8s/and 9s. The children can continue to use Times Table Rock Stars/over the holiday to develop their recall of these facts.

Early nights, restricting technology if it distracts and an understanding that Year 6 is a step up and therefore perhaps an anticipation of some anxiety due to SATs and the move to high school.

We will keep you updated regularly on what the children do in school through Class Dojo.
