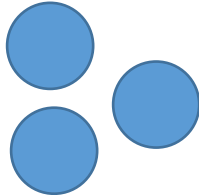


Maths- Addition

Today we are going to practise adding two numbers together.

Mrs Bassett has 3 coins and Miss Shevlin has 2 coins and we want to find out how many they have altogether. We need to count all the coins to find the answer. The answer is 5 so $3+2=5$.



Challenge

Can you find 3 toys (or objects) in your house to use? Can you find 3 different toys or objects? How many do you have altogether? So $3+3=6$.

Can you try to solve the problems either by using practical resources or by recording your work on paper by drawing spots?

Example

$$4 + 1 =$$

You need to draw 4 spots first and then 1 spot.



You now need to add them altogether. How many do you have?... 5 so $4+1=5$.

Now it is your turn...

$$4+2=$$

$$5+3=$$

$$6+4=$$

$$8+3=$$

$$10+5=$$

$$9+7=$$
